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NARRATION

Narration: “Then came the day of unleavened bread, when the passover must be killed And he sent Peter and John, saying, Go and prepare us the passover, that we may eat. And they said unto him, where wilt thou that we prepare? And he said unto them, Behold, when ye are entered into the city, there shall a man meet you, bearing a pitcher of water; follow him into the house where he entered in. And ye shall say unto the goodman of the house, the Master said unto thee, Where is the guest chamber, where I shall eat the passover with my disciples? And he shall show you a large UPPER ROOM furnished: there make ready. And they went, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the passover.” *(Luke 22:7-13)* *The Narrator begins to speak at measure 1 in:

1- “CAME THE MEN OF JESUS”

Narration: “And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him. And there was also a strife among them, which of them should be accounted the greatest. And he said unto them, The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and they that exercise authority upon them are called benefactors. But ye shall not be so: but he that is greatest among you, let him be as the younger; and be that is chief, as he that doth serve.” *(Luke 22:14, 24-26)*

3- “WHO WOULD BE THE GREATEST”

Narration: “Jesus know that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he was come from God, and went to god: He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. After that he poureth water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples’ feet, and to wipe them with a towel wherewith he was girded.” *(John 13:3-5)*

4- “THE WASHING OF FEET”

Narration: “Then cometh he to Simon Peter; and Peter saith unto him, Lord, dost thou wash my feet? Jesus answered and said unto him, What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter. Peter saith unto him, thou shalt never wash my feet. Jesus answered and said unto him, If I wash thee not, thou hast no part of me. Simon Peter saith unto him, Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head.” (*John 13:6-9*)

Narration: “And he took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me. Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, This cup is the New Testament in my blood, which is shed for you.” (*Luke 22:19-20*)

9- “BLESSED BE THE NAME OF THE LORD”

Narration: “But, behold, the hand of him that betrayeth me is with me on the table. And truly the Son of man goeth, as it was determined: but woe unto that man by whom he is betrayed! And they began to inquire among themselves which of them it was that would do this thing.

Now there was leaning on Jesus’ bosom one of his disciples, whom Jesus loved. Simon Peter therefore beckoned to him, that he should ask who it should be of whom he spake. He then lying on Jesus’ breast saith unto him. Lord, who is it?

Jesus answered, He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped it. And when he had dipped the sop, he gave it to Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon. And after the sop Satan entered into him. Then said Jesus unto him, That thou doest, do quickly. Now no

man at the table knew for what intent he spake this unto him. For some of them thought, because Judas had the bag, that Jesus had said unto him, But those things that we have need of against the feast; or, that he should give something to the poor. He then having received the sop went immediately out; and it was night.” *(Luke 22:21-23 and John 13:23-30)*

10- “JUDAS”

Narration: “Therefore, when he was gone out, Jesus said, Now is the Son of man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God be glorified in him, God shall also glorify him in himself, and shall straightway glorify him. Little children, yet a little while I am with you. Ye shall seek me: and as I said unto the Jews, Whither I go, ye cannot come; so not I say to you. A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another: as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.” *(John 13:31-35)*

11- “A NEW COMMANDMENT”

Narration: “Simon Peter said unto him, Lord whither goest thou? Jesus answered him, Whither I go, thou canst not follow me now; but thou shalt follow me afterwards. Let not your heart be troubled; ye believe in god, believe also in me. Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you; not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.” *(John 13:36; 14:1, 27)*

Narration: “These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee.” *(John 13:31-35)*
